


Fun Facts about GCM!

George Catlett Marshall was a great American statesman who played a crucial role in international affairs from 1939-1951, the years that shaped the second half of the 20th century.

Marshall was a five star general who served as Chief of Staff over the U.S. Army during World War II. In this role, he was, in the words of Winston Churchill, the “true architect of victory” in the European arena. After the war, while serving as Secretary of State, Marshall developed what became known as the Marshall Plan to help rebuild and modernize Europe. For his many contributions, George C. Marshall earned the Nobel Peace Prize in 1953.

Useful Information

Statesmen Start: Event held the week before school where students can pick up their class schedules and turn in paperwork. Parents and students can purchase spirit wear and visit various tables to join or learn about what is happening at GCM.

School hours: Doors open at 7:50 a.m. Monday – Friday, and classes begin at 8:10 and end at 2:55. Offices close at 4:00. Detailed bell schedules can be found at www.marshallhs.fcps.edu/about/bell-schedule

Block Scheduling: School days alternate between Red and Blue days. On Red Days, students attend class periods 1, 3, 5, and 7. On Blue Days, they attend 2, 3, 4, and 6. This schedule is set at the beginning of the year and does not change if there is a missed school day.

Learn: Learn is a 30 minute study period held each day between blocks 1 and 2 where students can meet with a teacher to get help, make up missed work, etc.

Building Layout: The building is 2 story with all rooms on the 1st floor having numbers in the 100's and rooms on the 2nd floor in the 200's. Each hallway has a letter from A - F. Academic departments are usually grouped together.

Back to School Night: Event held in September in the evening where parents can visit their

child's classes and teachers. Parents need to bring a copy of their child's schedule. There are also opportunities to purchase spirit wear and visit various tables to join or learn about what is happening at GCM.

Principal Coffees: Events held in the fall for parents in each class (freshmen, sophomores, juniors, and seniors) to hear a message from the principal and ask questions.

Student Information System (SIS): SIS is the online source of information about your student, such as grades, attendance, and health data.

Senior Events: There are several events held each year for graduating seniors. **Prom** is a formal dance in the spring for juniors and seniors held at a local hotel. **Baccalaureate** is a non-denominational service held at a local church or temple that pays tribute to the graduating class with music, student reflections, and a blessing. Baccalaureate is planned and run by students. The **All Night Grad Celebration (ANGC)** is an alcohol-free all night party held the night of graduation at a local health club or rec center that includes food, games, and prizes to celebrate seniors. ANGC is planned and run by parents.

Pay for School Stuff: Pay for School Stuff (P4SS) is a website (www.pay4schoolstuff.com) where you can pay PTSA dues and purchase items such as magnets and yard signs.
